Globsyn Crystals launched

Globsyn Technologies Ltd and Intelligent Infrastructure Ltd Thursday announced the launch of a new IT workspace infrastructure project at Salt Lake Electronics project called Globsyn Crystals.

The complex, which would have two towers to be completed by October, 2007 would be built on a six-lakh-sqft area with a project cost of Rs 150 crore.

The work-habitat project, conceptualised by Bikram Dasgupta, chairman of Globsyn Technologies will have intelligent offices, digital theatres, retail outlets, health clubs and learning centres.

"Today there is a growing need to merge technology with life, to create an attrition free work habitat. With a combination of work and leisure, the new workspace would keep attrition at bay," said Mr Dasgupta.

The initiative was inaugurated by Manabendra Mukherjee, the state IT minister.

According to Mr Mukherjee, around 13.3 million sqft of new workspace is coming up for the IT industry in the next 24 months.

"As more and more new IT companies are showing interest to set up their shops in the state, there is a growing need to develop newer space in the city," said Mr Mukherjee. ♦
